What is the Outstanding Youth in Education Award (OYEA)?

The Award honours the achievements of young educators who have a passion and commitment to teaching, inspiring and nurturing their students.

Launched in 1999, it seeks to recognise excellent younger teachers for their youthful idealism, enthusiasm, energy and active involvement in the development of youth beyond the formal curriculum.

What is the age limit to be nominated for OYEA?

From 2012, the age criterion for OYEA has been revised to 35 years and younger, in alignment with the national definition of youth.

Who nominates the OYEA Finalists and Winners?

The OYEA Finalists and Winners were nominated by the schools and the members of public and shortlisted by the Ministry of Education (MOE) for interviews by the OYEA Selection Panel. The Selection Panel comprises representatives from the MOE, the National Institute of Education (NIE), the Community and Parents in Support of Schools (COMPASS), the National Youth Council (NYC), and a past Outstanding Youth in Education Award (OYEA) winner.
